

Mr. Alexander Conyers was assigned as the Chairman, Army Clemency and Parole Board on 31 October 2016. In this capacity, he is responsible for the oversight and conduct of Army Clemency and Parole Board hearings for Soldiers confined in Army Corrections System facilities and those transferred to the Federal Bureau of Prisons for incarceration. He also oversees hearings for former Soldiers on parole or mandatory supervised release. He is also responsible for monitoring the behavior of all former Soldiers under supervision by U.S. Probation Officers. The Army Clemency and Parole Board conducts over 900 clemency and parole board hearings annually.

Mr. Conyers served as a Military Police officer in the U.S. Army, beginning his military service in 1983 as an enlisted Soldier- he retired as a Colonel in January 2016. His career included assignments in South Korea and throughout the United States in various command and staff positions.

He commanded the 249th Military Police Detachment (Confinement Facility), South Korea and the 525th Military Police Battalion, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. He also served as the Executive Officer for the 19th Military Police Battalion (CID), South Korea and served in combat as the Deputy Director for Detainee Operations in Kabul, Afghanistan. Additionally, he served as Chief of the US Army Corrections Branch, The Pentagon; Washington, DC.

He culminated his military career as the Commander, 16th Military Police Brigade at Ft, Bragg, NC. In this capacity, he led over 3,600 Soldiers and civilians conducting law enforcement and fire and emergency services across four military installations; Ft. Bragg, North Carolina, Ft. Stewart, Georgia, Ft. Campbell, Kentucky and Ft. Drum, New York.

Mr. Conyers holds a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from South Carolina State University, a Master's degree in Corrections from the University of South Carolina and a Master's degree in Public Administration from Troy University. He is a graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff and completed his War College studies at the Canadian Forces College in Toronto, Ontario. Conyers is also a graduate of the FBI National Academy, Quantico Virginia.

He is a Certified Corrections Executive by the American Correctional Association. He is also a member of the International Association of Paroling Authorities, the American Probation and Parole Association and the International Association of Chiefs of Police.
